New Jersey Domestic Worker Bill of Rights (S723/A822) Additional Resources

The Senate Bill S732/ Assembly Bill A822 is sponsored by Senator Richard J. Codey and Assemblywoman Britnee N. Timberlake – NJ Legislature and introduced into the New Jersey Senate on June 30, 2021. The bill is advanced by the National Domestic Workers Alliance (NDWA)* and the New Jersey Domestic Worker Coalition - a coalition composed of 34 workers centers, non-profit organizations and unions who have been organizing domestic workers since 2019.**

The bill introduces protections under New Jersey Law that strike historical exclusions of domestic workers from workplace protections offered to all other workers in the state and raises industry standards critical for improving working conditions of domestic workers. NDWA has successfully fought to include these type of protections through passage of similar Domestic Worker Bill of Rights in ten states and two cities: New York (NY) 2010,¹ Hawaii (HI) 2013,² California (CA) 2013 and 2016,³ Massachusetts (MA) 2014,⁴ Connecticut (CT) 2015,⁵ Oregon (OR) 2015,⁶ Illinois (IL) 2016,⁷ and Nevada (NV) 2017,⁸ Seattle, WA, 2018,⁹ New Mexico (NM) 2019,¹⁰ Philadelphia, PA 2019¹¹ and Virginia (VA), 2020 and 2021.¹²

The Center for Women and Worker (CWW), at the School of Management and Labor Relations at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey issued a report in September 2020 and an Issue Brief in November 2020 concerning Domestic Workers in New Jersey. In the summer and fall of 2019, data was collected from 414 domestic workers focused specifically on nannies, housecleaners and home care workers from across New Jersey using a survey in English, Spanish, and Nepali. CWW also engaged in an analysis of U.S. labor force survey data to report on overall trends in the number of domestic workers, their demographic composition, and their hourly wages.

The report details unique challenges that domestic workers experience and the policy recommendations that stemmed from the research are the basis of the New Jersey Domestic Worker Bill of Rights. The *report* and *issue brief* are available.
